THE CONCEPT AND BRANCHES OF THE CONFERENCE

The history that now affects every individual is world history. (C. W. Mills)

"The sociological imagination enables its possessor to understand the larger historical scene in terms of its meaning for the inner Russia's full-scale invasion of Ukraine on February 24, 2022 was a global challenge and a shock to many individual destinies. Right now, the current boundaries of individual experience and large-scale historical events are becoming more palpable than ever.

Social transformations require a comprehensive study, both in macro and micro dimensions, both from the perspectives of various branches of science and outside the "politics of disciplines", sometimes even without the usual division into social and material. What can sociology offer here and what is its place in interdisciplinary approaches to the study of armed conflicts and their consequences?

What awaits Ukraine and the world in the context of the current crisis related to the aggression of the Russian Federation? How will its position in the World-system change in this context? Is a model of a "state that promotes development" possible in post-war Ukraine?

One of the proposed visions is historical macrosociology, which allows us to consider current realities and trends in the holistic dynamics of historical systems, find global explanations of local trends and determine the appropriateness of certain historical analogies.

The role of the sociologist-researcher acquires a special role in the context of the armed conflict. Is sociology possible in a bomb shelter? How will it differ from sociology from an office with a view of the campus of a Western university or an Asian university? Can sociology in this case be free from value judgements? Does a sociologist have the right to be involved and should he distance himself from his own experience in his scientific research? And, finally, can and how can sociology help solve practical problems that arise during armed conflict?
